D6 – COMOROS

F6KOP team member F6AML, Sam, tells The Daily DX he will QRV from the Union of the Comoros (AF-007) as D68F from November 13th to 23rd. Activity will be on CW and SSB only on 1.8 through 28 MHz. He will be using an FT-857D and OM Power 2500. All equipment, except the amplifier, will be donated to the Union of the Comoros for a future club station which is planned for being located in Moroni. Sam will have two phased quarter wave verticals on 160 meters with a K9AY receiving antenna. On 3.5 through 10 MHz he will be using 1/4 wave verticals and a Spiderbeam on 14 through 28 MHz. Look for a special emphasis on Topband and the low bands. His sunrise will be around 0240Z and sunset around 1514Z. Sam won't have access to the packet cluster or the Internet so no skeds and no need for anyone to ask on the cluster "When on X band or mode!" Below are the suggested frequencies that D68F will be transmitting on. Sam will be listening up or down 5 KHz.

YJ - VANUATU

The Croatian team heading to Vanuatu next year has given their dates. Look for 9A6DX (YJ0DX), 9A6XX (YJ0XX) and 9A8MM (YJ0MM) to be QRV from Efate Island (OC-035) from January 21-28, 2010. Activity is expected on 1.8 through 28 MHz on CW, SSB and RTTY. They have a Web page at <http://vanuatu.rkp.hr/>. QSL via 9A8MM.

VP8/G – SOUTH GEORGIA ISLANDS

MM0DWF/DL9LB, Lars, finally made it to Husvik, South Georgia Island and tells US that he will be active as VP8DIF whenever his work schedule allows. The weather has been very bad and he hopes his antenna will stay up in the 80+ knot winds. QSL via DJ9ZB.

H44 – SOLOMON ISLANDS

H44MY/KM9D, Mike and H44TO/KF4TUG, Jan, say they've used the "railway" to beach and dry their boat and put on new bottom paint. With that job complete the boat is once again lying at anchor off the Solomons. Mike has been QRV on 160 and 80 since mid week last week. Mike and Jan are on Liapari Island, part of the New Georgia Group for IOTA, OC-149. It's southeast of Vella Lavella and is connected by a causeway with foot bridge. Gizo Island is another 13 miles south-southeast, and it's the administrative center of Western Province. Length of stay was not mention, but he normally sticks around for about a week so he is expected for another few days. QSL via OM2SA.

PY0T – TRINIDADE AND MARTIM VAZ IS.

The ZY0T Trinidad & Martin Vaz Islands team, is on a four day operation from this semi-rare one. They are expected to be QRV on 1.8 through 28 MHz on CW, SSB and RTTY. So far there has not been any RTTY activity reported. The four man team are expected to QRT tomorrow, October 20th. They have a Web site at <http://riodxgroup.dxwatch.com/trinidade-2009>. QSL via PY1NB.

ACTIVITIES FROM VENEZUELA

YV5SSB, Alex, updates The Daily DX on some upcoming activities of the 4M5DX Group. A January 2010 operation from Aves Island (YW0A) is in the works for three or four weeks. They still need to negotiate the length of stay with the Venezuelan Navy. They 4M5DX Group is also working on a number of IOTAs. First one expected in November to December of this year on Orchila Island (SA-054) as YW5O. In February 2010 they will try YW7IOTA from Coche Island (SA-012) and in March 2010 from Patos Island (SA-048) as YW5P.

VK9X – CHRISTMAS ISLAND

VK9X/G6AY with operators G3SWH and G3RTE will be active from Christmas Island February 20-27. It's OC-002 for IOTA and is #66 on DX Magazine's 2008 most wanted survey, worldwide. Phil and Jim will be CW only, all bands 80-10, going with the best propagation with two stations on the air as many hours a day as possible. They hope to work as many North American, European and "Rest of the World" (ROTW) stations on as many bands as possible. QSL via G3SWH, direct with SAE and return postage or via Phil's web site, www.g3swh.org.uk for a bureau reply, or the regular way with a bureau card. www.g3swh.org.uk/christmas-island.html for more info.



The following frequencies are considered IOTA meeting places: CW - 28040, 24920, 21040, 18098, 14040, 10115, 7030 and 3530 KHz; SSB - 28560, 28460, 24950, 21260, 18128, 14260, 7055 and 3755 KHz.

• **SA-019** – ZZ6Z with three operators, PY6HD, PY6RT and PY6AWU will activate Abrolhos Island, SA-019, October 29-November 2. Look for them on 3.7 through 28 MHz on SSB only. The Brazilian Navy schedule could affect the dates. QSL via PY6HD direct only. <http://www.qrz.com/db/ZZ6Z>.

DX Bits and Pieces

• **4L – Georgia** – 4L8A in Georgia will be in the CQWW SSB October 24-25. He will be single operator single band 20 meters. QSL via K1BV.

• **5R – Madagascar** – G4OHX, Sam, plans to be in Madagascar from December 28th until January 3, 2010. He hopes to be QRV as 5R8HX. Afterwards he'll be in South Africa and operating as ZS5/G4OHX from January 4th to 17th.

• **5R – Madagascar** – 5R8ZO in Madagascar will be in the CQWW CW, November 28-29 with N5ZO operating this one too, single op all band high power. QSL via OH0XX.

• **8P – Barbados** – 8P5A is the CQWW SSB Barbados callsign for successful contest operator W2SC this time. He will be single op all band high power as usual. QSL via NN1N.

• **9Y – Trinidad and Tobago** – 9Y4W on Tobago will be N6TJ again going for a CQWW CW win to add to his collection, although this time he apparently plans to be single op single band rather than all band. He hasn't given us the band yet.

• **CN – Morocco** – DL1DAW, Achim, plans to do a holiday style DXpedition to Dar Bouazza (south of Casablanca), Morocco from October 15-21. He has been told verbally his callsign will be CN2AW and he should receive his paper work next week. Achim will most likely be using CN2DX's, Andre's, antennas during the Worked All Germany Contest. Listen for Achim periodically on CW, SSB, RTTY on 3.5 through 28 MHz. QSL via DL1DAW.

• **CT3 – Madeira Islands** – A small group from the Madeira Islands called the CT3 Friendly DX Group will operate CQ3Z during the CQ World Wide SSB DX Contest. Team members include CT3AB (ex CT3KB), CT3FH and CT3KO.

• **DU – Philippines** – DL4IAS, Manfred, will be vacationing from Bantayan Island (OC-129), Philippines between October 20th and November 5th. Look for DV7/DL4IAS to be on PSK, SSB and CW on 40, 30 and 20 meters. QSL via DL4IAS.

• **E5 – South Cooks** – E51CG, Victor, is QRV on 6 meters and reports opening to Hawaii. He has an IC706 running 100 watts into a 5 element yagi at 58 feet. Victor thanks W7GJ, KS7S, N3DB and "The Worldwide Beacon Project", W5WVO and ZL1RS for helping to get him back on 6 meters. He is also trying to get his XYL, Eleanor, licensed, who might be the first every Cook Islander YL to have a ticket.

• **EA8 – Canary Islands** – AO8A from the Canary Islands will be a multi-two in the Phone CQ WW put on by EA8AH (OH1RY), EA8CAC, EA8ZS, EA5DY, OH1MA, OH3RB, OH5XT and OH6RX. QSL via OH1RY.

• **ES – Estonia** – OZ5AAH, Ben, will be QRV as ES1/OZ5IPA from Tallinn, Estonia during the International Police Association Contest on November 7th and 8th. Complete rules for the IPA contest can be found at www.ipa-rc.de. Ben will be on CW and SSB. QSLs are good for the Sherlock Holmes Award and can be sent to: Ben Jakobsen, Gjethusparken 25, 3300 Fr.værk, Denmark.

• **FK – New Caledonia** – After his operation from Hong Kong (see VR2 below) F5NHJ, Jean-Louis, will be QRV from Grande

Terre (OC-032), New Caledonia as FK/F5NHJ from October 26th to November 11th. He will also try to go to Lifou or Mare (OC-033). QSL via F5NHJ, preferably via the REF QSL Bureau and via LOTW.

• **FO – French Polynesia** – FO8RZ (F5PHW), Phil, plans to participate in the CQ World Wide SSB DX Contest from Tahiti, French Polynesia. He will do single band 15 or 10 meters.

The decision will be made as to which band at the last minute, most likely depending on conditions. QSL via F8BPN either direct or via the REF QSL bureau, and LOTW.

• **FP – St. Pierre and Miquelon Islands** – The FP/KV1J and FP/W8TOM operation on Miquelon has been rescheduled for November 7-15, so will not be in the CQWW SSB. They will be on 160-10M, primarily SSB and RTTY with "some CW and PSK31." They will also do some AO-51 satellite work, weather permitting. QSL to their home calls, bureau or LoTW. If direct, send via KV1J. <http://www.kv1j.com/fp/october09.html>.

• **HB0 – Liechtenstein** – A team of twelve Amateur Radio operators from the Rhine Ruhr DX Association have announced plans for their 26th DXpedition to Triesenberg, Liechtenstein starting October 18th through the 30th and including the CQ World Wide SSB DX Contest. During the Contest they will be using the HB0/HB9AON callsign.

• **HR – Honduras** – HR2DMR will be manning HQ2W from Honduras in the CQ WW Phone. This will be a SOAB HP effort. He will use the call between October 24th and 27th, including some activity on 12, 17, 30 and 60 meters, presumably outside the contest period. QSL via QRZ.COM address for HQ2W.

• **HZ – Saudi Arabia** – HZ1GW, Ken, is working on his Worked All States, "WAS." He says it has been extremely difficult at this point in the sunspot cycle to get the five he still needs, Kansas, New Mexico, Nevada, South Dakota and Wyoming. Ken says, "What makes it more difficult is that my shack is 2-1/2 hours' drive away and I can only operate on Thursday evening and Fridays, twice a month." Ken adds, "We were sort of promised 75 meters this year and we were also hoping for 30 and 60 meters, but still no sign." He says as soon as they are given permission for those bands he will be on. Saudi Arabia started issuing licenses in 2004. Ken has worked 250 countries total with 200 on 20 and just over 100 on 15, 18 and 40M each, "and time is running out." Ken has previously operated as A92HC and GW0RHC.

• **JT – Mongolia** – And JT1ZO will have Mongolia well represented in the WW SSB, with N5ZO operating, single op all band high power. QSL via OH0XX.

• **KH0 – Mariana Islands** – Japanese operators W1FPU, AH0BR, W1NDE and possibly others plan to activate AH0BT from Saipan, Northern Marianna Islands during the CQ WW Phone. They will be doing multi-two. QSL via 7L1FPU.

• **KP2 – U.S. Virgin Islands** – KP2/M1DDD starts operation from St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands, today. Nick will operate until noon local time on October 20th. He will be on 80-6M, mostly SSB but also a bit of RTTY, "which I have just gotten into!" he says. Nick has been in Tampa, Florida, visiting N1OXX, Russ.

• **TI – Costa Rica** – TI8M in Costa Rica will be a big WW SSB operation. W4KTR, K4UN, W4BW, W4XO, TI2KAC, TI2JCY and TI2ZM will team up, multi-two. QSL via TI2KAC.

• **TK – Corsica** – Look for IZ8GCB to be operating as TK/IZ8GCB from Corsica Island in the CQ WW DX CW. QSL via IZ8GCB direct.

• **V3 – Belize** – K8PT, Pete, is heading to Ambergris Cay (NA-073), Belize for a holiday style operation from November 24th to December 6th. He'll be operating as V31PT on 7 through 28 MHz on SSB, CW and RTTY. QSL via K8PT.

• **VP8/H – South Shetlands** – XR9JA is a South Shetland Islands (more typically a VP8) callsign that will be on the air January 10-25. This one will be on Greenwich Island at the

Arturo Prat Chilean Navy Base. On the operating team will be XQ5IE, CE6UFF, F6DXE and CE5COX, Luis, Carlos, Didier and Dago. <http://www.ce5ja.cl/>.

• **VR2 – Hong Kong** – F5NHJ, Jean-Louis, plans to be active between October 21st and 23rd from Cheung Chau (OC-006), Hong Kong as VR2NHJ. He'll have an FT-857, EEPIC, MP10 and I1UJX vertical. Concentration will be made on 30 meter digital modes. QSL via F5NHJ, preferably via the REF QSL Bureau and via LOTW. He has a Web page at www.f5nhj.

• **VR2 – Hong Kong** – VR2C will be active as M/S during CQ WW SSB from Hong Kong. QSL via WA4WTG and LOTW only. No QSLs via the bureau.

• **YB – Indonesia** – A large number of Indonesian ops will be activating YE2R in the CQ WW SSB DX Contest over the October 24/25 weekend. Behind the mic could be YB2DX, YB2LSR, YC2BBY, YB2BOB, YB2ECG, YD2DNA, YB2CPO, YC2KME, YC2JKG, YC2PQW, YB2TJV, YB2OBL, YB2VTO, YB2SSB, YB3PXF, YB3MM or YC2JVX. This will be a multi-two effort. QSL via EB7DX.

DXCC News

The ARRL DXCC Desk has approved the September/October 2009 FT5GA DXpedition to Glorioso for DXCC credit.

YI/KV4EB was originally credited for DXCC from April 20, 2003 to November 28, 2003. The DXCC program has gotten an update and approved now is April 20, 2003 through January 9, 2004. NC1L at the ARRL says, "If you had this operation rejected due to this date issue you can fix it in one of two ways: Send an email to dxcc@arrl.org or select it in your next LogBook of the World application, as the logs will soon be uploaded. Bill says, "This is ONLY if your QSO falls within the date period noted above."

KY6R, John, reports his most recent DXCC turn around time was less than a week, which he sent via USPS Priority.

W4VQ, Bob, sent in his endorsement on October 6, which was listed as received October 13 and by October 15 proper credits were given.
